You may have heard about similar problems in western Ohio, where Grand Lake St. Marys was closed last summer to swimming, boating and fishing by the Ohio EPA because of toxic algae blooms. Certainly, we do not want that to happen in our Indiana lakes.
- To help us better understand the relationship between plants and algae and water quality, we are happy to sponsor an important workshop on this topic. Jill Hoffmann, an aquatic biologist (and familiar face in Indiana lake management) will explore what is causing algal blooms and what we know about the risks of these blooms.
